Best of luck to the players that are leaving our Club and moving on to Secondary School. We hope to see you back at Old Boys Marist to continue your rugby career as a senior player.


To all our returning families and players for 2020, enjoy the summer. We look forward to seeing you again in February next year for Marist Academies and registration.

Christopher Mitchell – The hardest person to tackle when he's on the run! NEVER gets tackled first up. Balanced both on attack and in defence.



at the Marist 11th Grade Tournament after an exciting game against Ruahine.



Give your body a chance to metabolise any alcohol in your system by avoiding alcohol 24 hours before playing or training.

Put first aid. first

If you've been injured, don't drink alcohol until you've had treatment.

Re-hydrate with juice or water

After hard exercise it's important to top up with non-alcoholic beverages first. Alcohol will just dehydrate you further.

Know when enough is enough

Research shows the body's limit in a single session is about 6 drinks for a man, 4 for a woman (one drink being approximately a small glass of wine, a single measure of spirits or a half-pint of beer). Over a week, the limits are 21 drinks for men and 14 for women.
